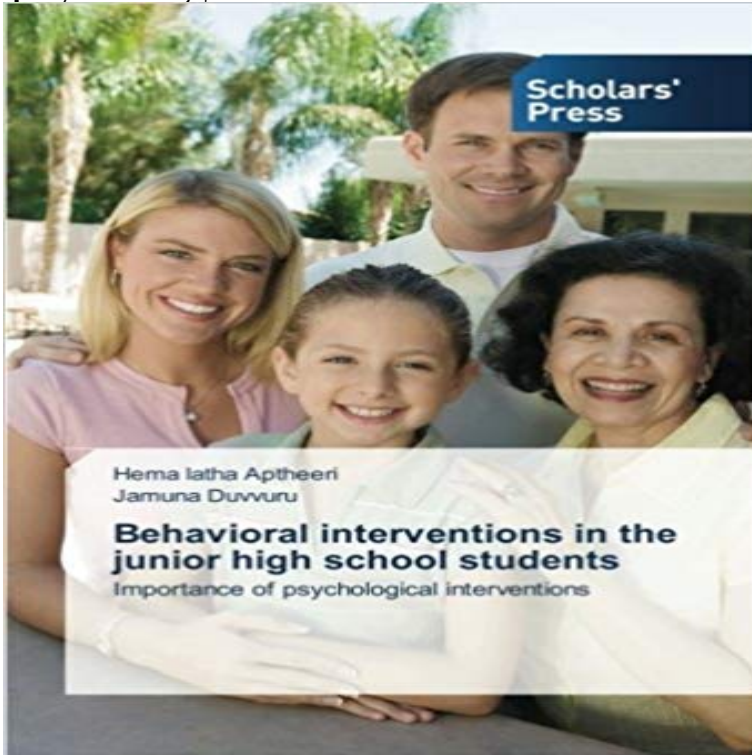


Behavioral interventions in the junior high school students: Importance of psychological interventions
